


Year 3 - Autumn term Bendy bags

<u>Key Vocabulary</u>	
Stitch	A loop of thread or yarn resulting from a single pass or movement of the needle in sewing, knitting, or crocheting.
Seam	A line where two pieces of fabric are sewn together
Accurate	Correct in all details.
Embroidery	Cloth decorated with embroidered designs.
Stiffening	Harden a fabric.
Fray	Unravel or become worn at the edge.
Applique	Decorate (a garment or larger piece of fabric) with pieces of fabric to form pictures or patterns.









Lesson sequence	
Evaluation of existing products	understand that bags are designed for different purposes and users <i>eg children, old people, walkers</i> identify criteria for a successful textile bag
Focussed tasks	understand that joining needs to be secure and strong understand that by modelling they can try out ideas quickly and check if an idea will work make a pattern/template with a seam allowance carry out simple fabric tests and choose fabric to meet functional requirements use simple decorative techniques know that plastic can be flexible
Design	write a simple specification bearing in mind the intended user produce drawings with labels to show what they intend to make and the sequence of their work order the sequence of their work
Make	construct their 'bendy bag' with some accuracy
Evaluate	evaluate their product against their specification
Health and Safety	take care with the storage of sharp objects <i>eg needles</i> . Felt pads with lines drawn on are useful for storing and checking needles. On-going work with needles attached can be stored in resealable bags follow instructions for the correct storage, use and disposal of fabric dyes and paints
