4. Can I research what it would be like to be poor in Victorian times?
5. Can I find information about Victorians in Southport?
6. Can I write a report on the Eliza Fernley Disaster? (*Extended Writing opportunity*)

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Key Vocabulary

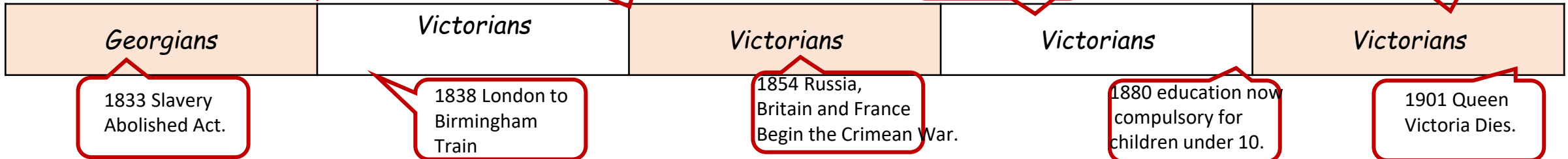
Classes	People grouped by economic status.

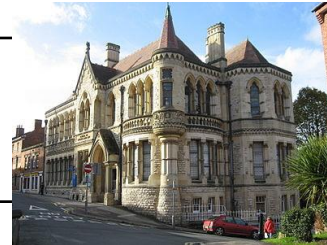

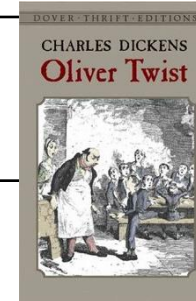
