	Key Vocabulary
Motif	A single movement or short phrase of movement which expresses the style or the theme of the dance.
Hakka	Is a traditional war cry, war dance, or challenge in Māori culture. It is a posture dance performed by a group, with vigorous movements and stamping of the feet with rhythmically shouted accompaniment.
Street dance	An informal style of dance involving a variety of moves, which is popular with young people and often developed in public spaces such as streets, clubs, playgrounds, etc.
Stag leap	A stag leap is a type of split jump used in genres of dance like ballet.
Dynamics	The way in which the movement is executed
Rebound	A small jump, feet together to tuck jump position in the air.
Composition	A dance composition focuses on the beginning, the middle, the end, and on the movement between these points.


