What are the names of all the different parts of our bodies?

Core Knowledge:

- H6 to learn the importance of, and how to, maintain personal hygiene
- H7 to learn some diseases are spread and can be controlled; the responsibilities they have for their own health and that of others; to develop simple skills to help prevent disease spreading

Lesson 1:

Can I identify how infections (such as coughs and colds) can be spread? Can I describe simple steps that I can take to prevent germs being passed on (eg: hand washing, use of tissues, covering their mouth when they cough)?

Lesson 2:

Can I describe some basic personal hygiene routines? Can I recognise why this is important?

Lesson 3:

Can I describe changes that have happened to me since I was a baby? Can I describe some things they I do now that I could not do before? Can I explain how my needs have changed since I was a baby?

Lesson 4:

Can I identify and compare physical differences between boys and girls? Can I recognise and use the correct names for main parts of the body including external genitalia?

Lesson 5:

Can I identify what goes on to and into people's bodies and how this can make people feel? Can I recognise that household products (including medicines) can be harmful if not used correctly? Can I describe ways of keeping safe around household products (including medicines) Can I identify people we can trust to tell us to put things onto and into our bodies?

Lesson 6:

Can I demonstrate an understanding that I have a right to 'be safe on the outside' and 'feel safe on the inside'? Can I explain what they I say or do if I feel unsafe or think something is not safe?

Lesson 7:

Can I identify the people who look after me in school and outside of school? Can I explain what I can do if I feel nervous about something being safe or unsafe (including saying 'no', 'I'll ask', 'I'll tell')? Can I identify whom I can go to if they are worried about something? Link to curriculum intent statement:
