Animal Types

Key Vocabulary	Definition
Amphibians	Amphibians live in the water as babies and on land as they get older. They have smooth skin
Mammals	Mammals are animals that breathe air, grow hair or fur and feed on their mother's milk
Reptiles	All reptiles breathe air. They have scales on their skin
Carnivore	Animals that mostly eat other animals (meat)
Herbivore	Animals that only eat plants are called Herbivores
Omnivore	Animals that eat both plants and other animals are Omnivores
Senses	When the body perceives a stimulus e.g. touch, taste, smell, sight, noise
Parts of the body	To recognise parts of the body, including, head, legs, arms, neck, torso

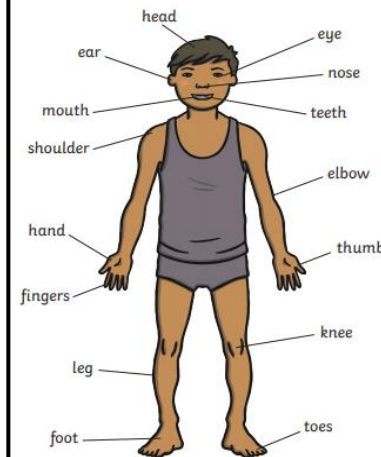

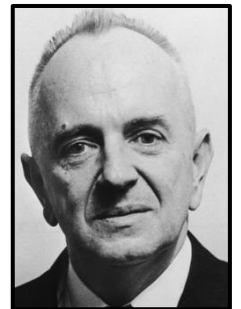

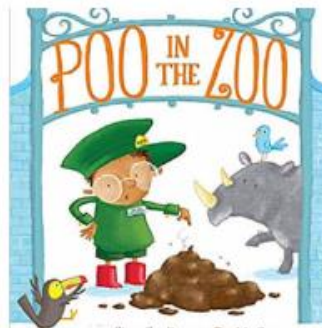
